



### **Notes for Sunday, March 7**

- A rostered adult must be the second referee—NO players! NO exceptions!
- If you are cold, wear approved outerwear. Both the older and newer "Certified Official" jackets are acceptable. If you do not have approved outerwear, you can wear a shirt under your uniform polo.
- If you are unable to enter the scores from your match, make sure to tell the desk that the scores have not been entered when you return the score sheet—do not just put the completed score sheet in the box.
- Do not use cell phones on the stand!
- When in doubt, accept a protest, even if you think it is not protestable. Let us come and handle it.
- Puerto Rican officials – wear your patches! You earned them!
- Pay attention to the benches and locations of players—players should be standing near the end of the bench and off the playing area.
- Before you get on the stand to begin your match, CHECK the score sheet and confirm everything is filled out correctly. Make sure the teams are recorded on the correct sides for both Set 1 and Set 2; make sure Serve/Receive has been recorded for both sets, including the X for the receiving team for both sets; check to see that the scorer has entered the lineups correctly.
- If you are concerned about the competency of your scorer, it is acceptable to get off the stand between sets and check-in with your scorer to be sure everything is correct. Do not linger at the table—quickly confirm the score sheet is accurate and return to the stand.
- When you finish the matches on your court, if your replacement referee has not arrived, please inform the championship desk that the referee is not at the court.
- Instead of having the Baller TV worker on the other side of the court, it is acceptable to have 3 (no more than 3) workers at the scoring table.
